#### Play I-SPY with MY LITTLE READING EYE!

Retrieval skills are how you find key details or information in a text and extract them. It helps you to make sense of what you are reading and so enjoy it more.

You cannot move on to higher level skills (such as making inferences) without first being able to retrieve information. It is the most crucial reading skill for understanding deeper meanings and for reading for life.

To help develop retrieval skills, play I-spy reading style! Instead of spotting physical objects, the guesser should identify key concepts, characters or vocabulary. For example, "I spy with my little eye a word which means the same as happy."

I spy with my little eye...

An adjective (describing word) beginning with... A character who...

A word (verb) which means to... A word which means the opposite of...

As we celebrate Black History Month, we were lucky to be able to watch a captivating demonstration of Capoeira Antiga, led by Mr. Martins from PE, and two visiting student capoeiristas, Zion Cinco Minutos & Adam Serra Leoa.

Capoeira's roots trace back to the times of slavery in Brazil where it was developed by enslaved African people as a way to resist oppression and maintain their cultural identity. It combines martial arts, dance, and music - movements are fluid and expressive, often resembling a dance, but with underlying self-defense techniques.

Students sang along and provided rhythm accompanyment to traditional instruments - the berimbau, pandeiro, agogo and atabaque - whilst watching an incredible demonstration!
